Spelling Expectations	Practice spellings 10 minutes each day for Wednesday's test. Look, cover, write, check
Reading Expectations:	Read to a grown up or sibling at least for 10 minutes each day and write in your Reading Record. Teachers read daily with all children during Guided Reading sessions for 30 minutes every morning.

Maths Expectations:

Recall multiplication and division facts for the 2,3,5 and 10's.
Write numbers to 100 in words.
Count money – addition and subtraction.

Dedicating time each day to Reading helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks for this term! Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome.

Remember there is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

We have indicated below with each task what the main subject focus could be.

Can you add some amounts together? Be 10% braver!</i> Maths</p>	<p><i>Follow a simple recipe and create something tasty!</i> DT</p>
<p><i>Research a significant person.</i> History</p>	<p><i>Create a Timeline of some significant people.</i> History</p>	<p><i>Write a prayer of your choice to read out to the class during collective worship.</i> RE</p>
